The Millstone collar, with its deep garter furrows reminiscent of the millstones cutting face, is with a touch of irony a quick and easy project that you might just finish in a single afternoon. Knit flat from end-to-end in the ultra-soft Yana XL from Amano Yarns, the Millstone collar is a striking accessory and the ultimate layer for a Melbourne winter.

One size, variable length

Finished sample, 62cm x 18cm

YARN

WEIGHT Super Bulky

YARDAGE Approx. 50m (54y)

SAMPLE <u>Amano Yana XL | Pink Bomb 1408</u>

50m/200g (54yrds/7oz)

GAUGE

6 stitches and 9 rows over 10cm (4") in stocking stitch on 12mm needles.

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

12mm (US size 17) straight or circular needles

WE SUGGEST

Tulip Knina Swivel 60cm Circulars | 12mm

Notions

Tapestry needle

Large button

ABBREVIATIONS

k Knit

k2tog Knit two stitches together

p Purl

YO Yarn over needle





MILLSTONE PATTERN

PATTERN BEGINS

Cast on 11 stitches using cable cast on.

Row 1: k

Row 2: k5, turn work

Row 3: k

Row 4: k5, p5, k1

Repeat rows 1-4 until the collar measures 58cm, or 4cm shorter than desired length.

BUTTONHOLE

Row 1: k2, YO, k2tog, k to end

Row 2: k5, turn

Row 3: k

Row 4: Cast off knit wise

FINISHING

Sew in ends and attach a button at opposite end to buttonhole.
